

Kids Read Over 70,000 Pages Over the Summer

100% of our summer camp attendees participated in our "Seven Book Summer" reading challenge. Our members read over 70,000 pages and over 1900 books! Every member read at least 7 books each and over half read 10 or more. Our members took trips to the library and had the opportunity to check out their own books. More than 70% of the students self-reported that they felt good about reading and about 60% reported that they liked reading more than they expected. In addition, BGC gave away over 400 books to members throughout August.

Serves over 62% more Kids in 2012 Summer Camp Program than the Previous Year

It was an amazing summer at our local Club for more than 680 youth – more than a 62% increase in attendance over last year, serving over 261 more youth than we did in 2011. Your support has helped us provide our members with the opportunity to participate in new summer programs for the first time including archery, fishing in partnership with Dane County Natural Resources and Scuba lessons in partnership with MadisonScuba at Sun Prairie High School. BGC was able to keep our doors open over 540 hours during the summer providing our campers with nutritious meals and quality educational programming while having fun and learning at the same time. In addition, for the first time this year due to an increase in attendance, our summer camp program expanded to Wright Middle School and Edgewood High School.

Offers Paid Internships, Career Exploration and College Tours for Over 50 Kids





Summer was not only fun, but productive and educational for many of our older kids too! Because of you, we were able to partner with local businesses to provide internships for 32 teens. Our teens were given the opportunity to spend part of their summer gaining real-world work experience at local businesses such as St. Mary's, Great Lakes, Fiskars Brands, BMO Harris, JH Findorff & Son, Saris Cycling Group, WORT Radio, and the Wisconsin Institute for Discovery. An additional 21 teens participated in our Career Exploration program, shadowing business leaders and touring workplaces such as the Dane County Attorney's Office, The Overture Center, Shopbop, Zebradog, Department of Justice Crime Lab, and UW Hospital and Clinics. In addition, our teens were given the opportunity to experience

campus life through touring colleges and universities throughout the

Midwest Region. These experiences would not have been possible without your continued support.

Our College Club program expanded f rom our two Club sites to over 250 students in four locations: Cherokee Middle School, Wright Middle School, Stoner Prairie Elementary and Verona Area High School.


