A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT & CEO



Dear Community Friend and Supporter,

WOW! This year has been exciting for the Boys & Girls Club of Dane County. Our Clubs are filled with youth ages 2.5 to 24 years of age. We have held in-person community events and started to prepare youth for skilled trades careers of the future. **Great Futures** indeed do **Start Here!**

Through **YOUR** generosity we supported our members, families, communities, and neighbors throughout Wisconsin by:

• Responding to community needs to provide services to 5,789 participants who received cleats, face masks, hand-sanitizer,

Microban, meals-to-go, and holiday meals. A total of 9,870 community meals were served and we secured over 200,000 N95 facemask from the State of Wisconsin and distributed to more than 5,000 people and nonprofits who visited our Clubs to gain access to these items.

• Raising over \$350,000 for Vel Phillips Statue, making the statue the first of its kind in the country and received unanimous approval from the State of Wisconsin.

Through **YOUR** generosity we are making the future for youth even brighter by:

- Supporting 1,815 middle, high school and college members enrolled in our School based programs and over 1,300 enrolled in Club based programs.
- Installing a new solar system at the Allied Family Center. The 85-kilowatt solar system is projected to reduce our electricity consumption by approximately 50%. The Club received a \$25k grant from Solar for Good to help make the project a reality and a generous donor covered the installation cost.
- Ensuring the safety of our Club facilities with the installation of new floors throughout the entire building at the Allied Family Center, a new roof at the McKenzie Family Center in Sun Prairie and upgraded lighting at McKenzie Family Center in Sun Prairie and Allied Family Center.
- Incorporating a new McKenzie Regional Workforce non-profit board and increasing our Metro Board and committees with over 100 volunteers. This is BGCDC's largest volunteer engagement to date.
- Building the largest youth workforce center in the history of Boys & Girls Clubs of America. The McKenzie Regional Workforce Center, a state-of-the-art skilled trades and entrepreneurial center for youth, will open the summer of 2023.

Through our collective efforts, BGCDC and I, received the following recognitions: 2022 Dane County Climate Champions Award for the McKenzie Regional Workforce Center, 2022 Boys & Girls Clubs of America National Innovation Award, 2022 Finalist for Madison 365 Community Choice Award, 2022 In Business Magazine Executive of Year, 2022 AFP Professional of the Year Award and 2022 Martin Luther King Humanitarian Award to recognize our work and commitment to youth and families in the community.

At BGCDC, we work hard to change the lives of young people in a positive way. But there is still much to do to meet the ongoing needs of young people in our community. We need your ongoing financial support to continue providing youth with experiences and opportunities needed for future success.

- Nearly 1,500 attendees came out to see Gladys Knight
- Over 500 guests attended the White Party
- The funds raised will provide new innovative programs for youth







BUILDING NEW PATHWAYS FOR SUCCESS AT THE McKENZIE REGIONAL WORKFORCE CENTER

Construction is underway! BGCDC and Madison Area Builders Association are on a path to addressing the shortage of trained skilled trades workers of the future. The new Center and Program will create opportunities for young adults to access resources, programming, and support systems that will mitigate achievement gaps, create economic opportunities, accelerate economic mobility and generate transformational change for families in South Central Wisconsin.

- The National Association of Home Builders announced their partnership with Boys & Girls Clubs of America. This relationship has grown from the McKenzie Regional Workforce Center groundbreaking ceremony and our Clubs partnership with the Madison Area Builders Association from July 2021
- Career force Build-Up skilled trades program has already begun

CLUB & SCHOOL BASED PROGRAM SUCCESSES

BGCDC Club Based and School Based innovative programs are designed to empower youth to excel in school, become good citizens and lead healthy, productive lives. Our programs serve youth ages 2.5 to 24 years through after school, out of school and summer programming. BGCDC has the largest public/private partnership with Madison Metropolitan School District through our AVID/TOPS program and expanded the program to Verona Area High School this academic year.

OUR IMPACT

- McKenzie Family Boys and Girls Club opened a licensed preschool serving ages 2.5 - 5
- 217 seniors from the AVID/TOPS program declared their post-secondary plans at College Decision Day
- Over 200 youth and families came out to enjoy an outdoor viewing of "Sing 2" at the Sun Prairie Movie Night
